In november 1996 (8/10th) IFCA's second meeting of the Latin-American countries was held in Asunción. I wish to share the deep joy of being all together in the diocesan house "Emmaus" for this important stage of IFCA's life, as you can learn from the final declaration (see page 3).

The first European continental meeting is going to take place in Malta during April 1997 from 4th to 6th (see page 6).

I trust that we will meet in a large number also in Buenos Aires to IFCA's second ordinary Assembly. Pay attention to the new date; September 11–14th 1997. IFCA's Secretariat met in Buenos Aires on november 7th and drew up the programme that we are sending you as an invitation (see page 8).

The date of IFCA's Assembly was changed to september since in november is going on the special Assembly for Latin America of the Bishops' Synod, foreseen by John Paul II as a step in the journey towards the Third Millennium.

As a member of the Pontifical Council for the Laity I was asked for a contribution to enrich the "work-document" that the pre-synodal Council has to draw up for the special Assembly for Latin America.

This contribution from the CA associations of Latin America has to consider the contents and the questionnaire contained in the "Lineamenta" published in the "Osservatore Romano" – spanish edition – of September 13th 1996. The aim is to offer elements of judgement, integration, enrichment.

I wait for your contributions within February 1997 in order to be able to arrange them and hand them over.

On August 20th 1996 John Paul II accepted Cardinal Eduardo Pironio's resignation as President of the Pontifical Council for the Laity and appointed as successor H.E. Mons. James F. Stafford, Archbishop of Denver. We already expressed and are now renewing our deep gratitude and our wish (see page 2).

Still in the light of the Lord's Birthday, in this year of preparation to the great jubilee of 2000 dedicated to Jesus Christ "the only Saviour yesterday, today, always", I send my hearty wishes to all of you, to your families, to your associations; so that, following the star as the Magi, we may announce and witness Christ to all people.

FINAL COMMUNICATION

Meeting in Latin America

On November 8th, 9th and 10th 1996, the representatives of the CA Associations from Argentina, Bolivia, Mexico, Paraguay, Perù and Venezuela, met in Asunción. Two members from IFCA's Secretariat – Italy and Malta – and the President of the Latin–America WUCWO were also there. Though some CA Associations of Latin America were absent, we have reflected upon

We have also confirmed our commitment, as individuals and as Associations, for the second IFCA's ordinary Assembly to be held in Buenos Aires in 1997 (September 11th–14th). The basic topic will be

In dialogue with God, in the Church, with the world and with the cultures

During our works we partecipated in the celebration of Eucharist with our Pastors and ecclesiastical Assistants; we went over the positive elements and the feeble points of our CA realities in Latin America: there are lights and shadows that we have acknowledged.

We have also looked together into some attitudes of Christ which we are to assume, both as individuals and as communities, so that our feeble points may be turned into positive elements and these into planning ability. In the light of the Word of God we have gone over the themes appointed for the year 1997 in the journey towards the Great Jubilee of 2000: a programme to be followed until the Third Millennium.

Thanks to this reflection upon the situation of each Country we have undertaken some concrete commitments:

- presenting a renewed image of CA
- coming close to the ecclesiastical Hierarchy with an attitude of service
- growing more and more in quality and quantity
- deepening our lay spirituality
- inviting new laypeople, especially the youth

- promoting a meaningful presence of our members in the social context of our particular Churches
- fostering in our members a formation which may turn into life

At the end of our continental meeting we have remembered Marcelo Zapiola, from Argentina, the first coordinator of IFCA's Secretariat – who already met the Lord and continues to be an example for all of us.

We want to walk together under the protection of Mary, our Mother from Asunción: may she lead and enlighten us, to be, like her, faithful to the Lord, in our journey to establish the Kingdom of God on the earth.

AN APPEAL FROM CATHOLIC ACTION AT BURURI IN BURUNDI

Don Salvatore Niciteretse, who is priest of the Cathedral in Bururi and Assistant of the CA in that diocese, is our point of reference for the news and the proposals that you can read here below.

Now that the lights of the massmedia on the dramatic situation in Burundi have gone out, we risk that our attention may be diverted on other things, with the secrete hope that the lack of news means that all problems there have been settled and the people's condition improved.

Unfortunately it is not so and the news coming directly from Burundi show a people and a Church in great difficulty in trying to build again the possibility for the two ethnic groups to live together.

Last may don Salvatore sent us a letter denouncing the dramatic acts of violence going on in his country and in his diocese where – only in March – 300 people were killed.

Half of the 80.000 inhabitants of his parish sleep the whole night in the open air or in the churches. "Even if there is no actual war, we are all afraid, the situation is dramatic". Those who attack are armed bands of soldiers who kill hutu and tutsi – women children, old people, animals – and destroy also buildings and houses, without facing directly the regular army.

Last june don Salvatore called in Rome, bringing with him a videotape, which records:

- in the I PART the crude and violent show of what can be seen in a village after a slaughter of children, women, old people.
- In the II PART a march for the peace: an initiative proposed by CA, inviting all to participate to show faith in the peace and will to live together.

Indeed in the past hutu and tutsi did live together and to this situation they ought to return to re-build a normal living: where people can meet and dialogue no act of intolerance happens (unless from abroad).

Don Salvatore is addressing an appeal to all CA-associations, asking them:

- A. to help the families very poor who give shelter to the war–orphans and/or to AIDS–sicks;
- B. to help the parents who undertake to build schools near their houses where their children – hutu as well as tutsi – may attend the secondary schools without moving far away from home ("municipal schools");
- C. to support CA's activities: marches, formation–seminars, labour–camps for the youth.

In Burundi, at Bururi the main goal is to collaborate with the CA in enlarging places and moments for meeting and for a common formation as a contribution to the reconciliation of the two ethnic groups and to the actual possibility of their living together as brothers and sisters.

The majority of the population is baptized.

CONCRETE PROPOSALS

A. TO HELP the families who shelter the war-orphans and/or the AIDS-sicks: about 300 only in don Salvatore's parish. They have heavy financial problems even to survive, nevertheless they are willing to share their life with the little orphans who are to be fed, to be dressed, to be sent to school.

Bururi diocese can bear the costs for 50 orphans.

The yearly costs for every child is 1000 dollars.

For the other 250 children the adoption can be a way to support them.

B. TO HELP the parents who joined in building 12 classrooms in three places of the parish: Minago, Bururi, Kaganza.

They have thought of "municipal schools".

There is indeed the problem of safety in sending the children to the secondary schools, which are 30/40 kms far.

The costs for building the classrooms are at these parents' charge: but they are able to contribute only for a part of them and ask for an integration. The government helps in providing teachers and books.

For each classroom: the parents are able to supply 4300 dollars.

They ask from us 3740 dollars (about 6 millions) for each classroom.

C. TO SUPPORT the CA's friends in their activities:

- Marches for the peace "together for the life" attended by minimum 200
 CA people from all groups: 3500 dollars.
- Formation-seminars for the youth of all ethnic and political groups: 6 days for 60 participants, at 3 dollars per day: 1080 dollars.
- Labour-camps for the youth:
 14 days for 150 participants,
 at 3 dollars per day: 6300 dollars.

All these proposals are being communicated to all CA-associations, IFCA's members, to strengthen the link of brotherhood on which IFCA's engagement is grounded.

The urgent problems in Burundi, the appeal from our CA friends at Bururi ask for our solidarity; the concrete actions suggested above allow to support formation–projects, educational choices which foster the values of living together, tolerance, brotherhood, all values that CA is committed to promote in every context.
