"In education is the seed of hope"

Introduction

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Dear sisters and dear brothers, welcome everyone and thank you for coming to share this moment!

It is a great joy to meet again in this space proposed by the International Forum of Catholic Action to reflect, pray and project our actions on the path of realizing a more Just and fraternal world.

Catholic Christians have just celebrated the feast of Jesus Christ King of the Universe, Jesus Christ who identified himself with the smallest of this world, the one who in the fullness of time will examine us in love. Christ whom we will contemplate throughout Advent and celebrate in a new Christmas proclaiming the joy of a God who became man so that men can live as children of God!

A God incarnate in human realities that today reveal the painful face of the effects of a pandemic that we have to overcome from a culture of care and unity, fraternity and social friendship, following the call of Pope Francis in the richness of his writings and their gestures.

The Holy Father alerts us in Laudato Sí about the cry of the Poor and the cry of the Earth, our common home and calls us to the realization of a new paradigm of integral human development that, from our own identity, reaches everything, that be with everyone and for everyone.

Today we tackle the challenge ACCION CATOLICA AND PACTO EDUCATIVO GLOBAL convinced that "In education is the seed of hope."

Pope Francis told us in his message of October 15 "In this context, we see that simplistic recipes or vain optimisms are not enough. We know the transformative power of education: to educate is to bet and give the present hope that breaks the determinisms and fatalisms with which the egoism of the strong, the conformity of the weak and the ideology of the utopians want to impose themselves as many times as the only one possible way."

The Educational Pact summons us all, school institutions, universities, social communicators, families, and the Church as Mother and Teacher of all, particularly to the associative and formative bodies of missionary disciples such as Catholic Action.

We will deepen with testimonies each one of the 7 commitments that the Pope asks of us, for which we have summoned Representatives of Children, Youth, Adults and Advisors from different Countries and Continents.

We will entrust this meeting to our Saints and Blessed educators to accompany us in each of the commitments assumed.

<u>First Commitment</u>: Putting the person at the center of every educational process,... we entrust ourselves to Saint Alberto Hurtado, Jesuit priest educator among the young and the poor.

<u>Second and Third Commitments</u>: Listen to the voice of children, adolescents and young people and encourage the full participation of girls and young women in education,... we entrust ourselves to the venerable Armida Barelli who with associative life makes women

protagonists, girls and young people, and the venerable Antonietta Meo (Nennolina), a girl who accepts the pain of illness for love of Jesus.

• We listen to two children from Argentina and two young people from Malta and Senegal with Jorge "Tuto" responsible for the Aspirants in Argentina and with Michele responsible with Luisa for the youth of ICA and for IFCA Youth Coordination..

<u>Fourth Commitment:</u> To have the family as the first and indispensable educator, ... we entrust ourselves to the Servants of God Adelina Abbo de Calvani and Aristide Calvani, a marriage of educators in the family and society.

<u>Fifth Commitment</u>: Educate ourselves to welcome, opening ourselves to the most vulnerable and marginalized,... we entrust ourselves to the Servant of God Antonio (Tonino) Bello, a bishop who is a witness of welcome at the service of peace and the poor.
