Let us join in prayer for the health of the Holy Father Pope Francis, for his quick recovery and for the fruits of his pastoral service so profound and necessary at this moment in the history of humanity. Next November we will celebrate together as a family the 30th anniversary of the International Forum of Catholic Action and we want to make this celebration a moment of thanksgiving and a prophetic moment to walk in the fulfilment of Catholic Action as a school of holiness, a gymnasium of ecclesial synodality and a witness of social friendship.

This celebration will coincide with the beginning of the next Synod on Ecclesial Synodality which will run from October 2021 to 2023. This journey of the whole Catholic Church in the world must count on the active and enthusiastic participation of all Catholic Action as promoters of communion, participation and mission based on the life of each diocese. For this it will be necessary to evaluate what has been done and to plan a more fruitful work that responds to the needs of all the People of God in order to be truly "missionary disciples of Jesus Christ in today's world".
