In recent months, Ukraine has found itself back in the global spotlight amid fears of a full-scale Russian invasion. According to western intelligence sources, some **100,000 Russian troops** have amassed at the Ukraine border ready for a military operation in the coming weeks.

A massive Jan. 14 **cybersecurity attack**, regarded by many as a **prelude to military action**, affected approximately 70 Ukrainian government websites, with an onscreen message warning users to "be afraid and expect the worst." People of Ukraine are fearing the worst – a full-scale Russian military invasion that would lead to numerous casualties and millions of refugees in Europe.

In this situation of fear and anxiety, Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church through the Synod of Bishops in Ukraine issued in November 2021 a special call to prayer and uninterrupted fasting over the next four months in the intention of peace, prevention of military threats and better future of Ukraine. We are convinced that prayer is crucial in resolving the Ukraine crisis. We have already witnessed that with the collapse of the Soviet Union 30 years ago and the events related to the Revolution of Dignity on Maidan.

We are also **grateful to the international community** for their ongoing support of our country and invite every Christian in the world and all people of good will to **pray for peace and justice in Ukraine**.



Pope calls for a day of prayer for peace over Ukraine situation

At the conclusion of Sunday's midday Angelus, **Pope Francis** expressed his concerns over the increasing tensions that threaten to overturn chances for peace in Ukraine and security on the European continent in general, given the wider

repercussions of any conflict. In response, the Pope has proposed that next Wednesday 26 January be a day of prayer for peace.

We have heard the voice of the Holy Father Francis, who has repeatedly expressed his **paternal closeness to the "beloved Ukraine"**, urging the powerful in the world to resolve the crisis through "serious dialogue and not with arms" (*Angelus of 12.12.2021*).

They invite the international community to offer its support to the country in the face of the danger of a Russian military offensive.

"We, as shepherds of the European Continent, want to appeal to the Leaders of the Nations so that they do not forget the tragic World Wars of the last century and so that international law as well as the independence and territorial sovereignty of each country will be defended. Together with the Holy Father, we want to call on

Governments to find "acceptable and lasting solutions" in Ukraine based on dialogue and negotiation and without resorting to arms."
