MONITION

We gather at this time, as a community, to contemplate the event of salvation that has changed the course of history, the death and resurrection of Jesus, and to welcome the sending that he makes to us to walk together and together proclaim to all the great love of God; to announce to all that our life has a future, has meaning.

Let us begin by making inner silence, putting aside all our worries and concerns, everything that takes away our peace, and become aware that we are before the Lord and before Him we place our life and our history, and also the life, concerns and hopes of all humanity.

Let us begin by requesting the presence of the Holy Spirit.

GOSPEL: Lc 23,33-47

When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him and the criminals there, one on his right, the other on his left. [Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do."] They divided his garments by casting lots. The people stood by and watched; the rulers, meanwhile, sneered at him and said, "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Messiah of God." Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself."

Above him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews."

Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation?"

And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." It was now about noon and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon

because of an eclipse of the sun. Then the veil of the temple was torn down the middle. Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit"; and when he had said this he breathed his last. The centurion who witnessed what had happened

glorified God and said, "This man was innocent & beyond doubt."

EXPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

TIME FOR ADORATION

MONITOR:

Christ is risen and lives forever, interceding with the Father for us all. He had said: "I will be with you always, to the end of time". GOSPEL: Lc 24, 1-8

But at daybreak on the first day of the week they took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb; but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus.

While they were puzzling over this, behold, two men in dazzling garments appeared to them. They were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground. They said to them, "Why do you seek the living one among the dead?

He is not here, but he has been raised. 2 Remember what he said to you while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners and be crucified, and rise on the third day." And they remembered his words.
